The third article "The Work Flexibility in the Context of SARS-CoV-2 Pandemic: The Case of Telework in Portugal" shows different dimensions of telework based on workers' perspective, namely: advantages and disadvantages, information and communication technologies in the workplace, employer power, the relationship between worker and supervisor, and the conciliation between work and personal life.

We believe that this issue of EJABM appeals to professionals and researchers in areas like management, accounting, and human resources. Moreover, we believe both firm managers and accountants can benefit from this issue of EJABM.

The next regular issue of EJABM will be published in September 2021.
